




July Precipitation

Drought Monitor




Late June: 12% of the region in moderate drought

Tuesday, July 26, 2016





- Below normal streamflow
 - Some at record and near record lows

Some reservoirs lower than average

Groundwater below normal

• Some wells running dry

Burn Bans

Clearfield County has enacted a thirty day burn ban effective 7/26/16 to 8/26/16.

Jefferson County has enacted a thirty day burn ban effective 7/28/16 to 8/28/16.

- Agriculture:
 - Dry soil
 - Slow growth
 - Stressed crops
 - Crop losses
- Fire:
 - Increased fire activity in some areas
 - Burn bans enacted

The Forest Fire Danger Level for Wednesday, July 27, 2016 is HIGH





July Temperatures






